



Help Sheet

Logging On:

- Cookies need to be enabled on the device you are using at home. If you usually “Block Cookies”, you will need to accept cookies while using the website; once finished using this site change your settings back to “always block” if this is your usual preference.
- Use a website browser and type in “Mathletics Log In”.
- Alternatively, download the Mathletics Student app.
- Pupils will have been given their log in details and a card with a QR code. Keep this safely; the QR code will allow them to log on to the app with greater confidence and independence.

Assigned Homework Tasks:

- Remind them to use the information/support button at the RHS and the Mathletics Dictionary.
- Encourage your child to spend additional time on the website. An extra 20 mins a day would help to build up good maths skills.

Pupil Accounts:

- Pupils can personalise their own account avatar and build up points weekly to use in MERITOPIA. If possible, spend some time with your child and become familiar with the structure and merit system.
- Points are accumulated weekly with a new week beginning on a Monday morning. The points for the week are recognised and stored by the website and pupils are awarded bronze certificates if they attain 1000 points during any week. These are then built up and on the 5th, 10th, 15th weeks of achieving they will be awarded silver awards. A **gold award** is achieved after 20 weeks of bronze certificates.
- The level at which pupils are working is differentiated within classes and suited to your child’s ability.

More Ideas:

- After finishing assigned tasks, they may choose to play LIVE MATHLETICS. This is a safe way for pupils to practise skills and play against others or the computer. There is no communication and no messaging; a pupil’s first name and initial for their surname is used. They will have instant feedback on their success.
- The MULTIVERSE area is also very useful; it is designed to increase multiplication fact fluency and recall. It is set in a rich, science-fiction world and should appeal to many pupils. Please locate in the “PLAY” area of Mathletics.
- Rainforest Maths is another area in MATHLETICS. It provides opportunity for further practice in the four processes, place value and fractions.
