# How do I choose a school for my child?

## ▶ **Best fit**

Some factors to consider –

- Proximity to home
- Pastoral care
- SEN provision
- Academic focus  
(grammar schools – top 40%)
- Extra curricular options

# Selection Process



<b>Grammar</b>	<b>All ability</b>
<p>To be considered for a grammar school place all pupils must sit an entrance exam (SEAG Test).</p>	<p>Places are allocated via the school's admissions criteria only.</p>
<p>Places are normally given primarily on rank order of scores.</p>	<p>Each school has their own criteria – such as siblings, eldest child, feeder primaries, etc.</p>
<p>Final places decided by school's admissions criteria.</p>	<p>Check school websites for details.</p>

# Strangford College Criteria for September 2026 (Grammar Pathway)

- ▶ Grammar Pathway based on SEAG score only – no other criteria apply unless a tie score at the cut-off point.
- ▶ Special Circumstances, Special Provision only applies to the Grammar Pathway.
- ▶ 46 places will be allocated in accordance with the rank order of Total Standardised Age Score (TSAS) achieved in the SEAG assessment (Highest score first). If places remain following the allocation of places based on TSAS, these places will be allocated to the All-Ability Pathway

# Strangford College Criteria for September 2026 (All Ability Pathway)

- ▶ Apply Religious balance – 35/35/30 split
- ▶ 1 Applicants who have placed Strangford Integrated College as first preference.
- ▶ 2 Applicants who have a sibling\*\*currently enrolled at the College.
- ▶ 3 Applicants who are the eldest\*\*\*, or only child of the family\*\*\*\*.
- ▶ 4 Applicants who are transferring from either a grant maintained or controlled Integrated Primary School.
- ▶ 5 Selection for any remaining places will be based on a unique random computerised number\* (which was allocated on receipt of applications) and will be used to allocate remaining places in ascending numerical order.

# Strangford College Data on 2025 Admissions



- ▶ 219 applications for 130 places.
- ▶ Vast majority first preference choices.
- ▶ 88 applications for Grammar Pathway.
- ▶ 46 applications accepted to Grammar Pathway. Tie breaker at 186

# SEAG (School Entrance Assessment Group)

SEAG is an organisation representing all of the grammar schools in N Ireland. The aim of the group is to provide an entrance examination to P7 children providing \*standardised outcomes to enable them to select pupils based on academic performance for their school. This replaces the previous AQE and GL system.

\*A standardised assessment is any form of test that requires all test takers to answer the same questions in the same way and is then scored in a 'standard' or consistent manner. This makes it possible to compare the relative performance of individual students or groups of students.

# SEAG Test Information

## Costs

SEAG registration fee - £20

Preparation Materials including a Summer Pack - £30  
(50/50 school contribution)

For all pupils entitled to Free School Meals there will be no cost (proof must be submitted when registering for SEAG)

# SEAG Test Information

## Overview

The Entrance Assessment consists of two papers – pupils sit both

- Paper 1 and 2 - Saturday November 2026
- Both papers assess English and Mathematics
- Both papers have an identical format consisting of 3 Sections

# SEAG Test Information

## Section 1 – The Practice Test

- 5 English questions
- 5 Maths questions
- Questions designed to help pupils settle before the Main Test begins
  - Practice Test not assessed

# SEAG Test Information

## Section 2 – The English Main Test

- 28 questions (Q1-Q28)
- Punctuation Exercise (5 multiple choice questions)
  - Grammar Exercise (5 multiple choice questions)
  - Spelling Exercise (5 multiple choice questions)
  - English Comprehension.
- Pupils read a passage- answer 13 questions (Q16-Q28)
  - Q16-Q22 multiple choice
  - Q23-Q28 free response

# SEAG Test Information

## Section 3 – The Maths Main Test

- 28 questions (Q29-Q56)
- Q29-Q50 multiple choice
- Q51-Q56 free response

## Other

- 60 minutes to answer the 56 questions
- Each multiple choice question has 5 possible answers
- Answer sheet provided

# Results

- ▶ Marked by GL Assessment (Independent English company)
  1. Grade
  2. Standardised Age Scores for both English & Mathematics
  3. Actual scores for both English & Mathematics

# Results

The following scores in **yellow** were needed to get in to the schools below in September 2025.

- ▶ Regent House – **193**
- ▶ Bangor Grammar– **185**
- ▶ Campbell College - **172**
- ▶ Glenlola– **170**
- ▶ Bloomfield – **185**
- ▶ St. Pat's Knock- **Band 1**
- ▶ The average SEAG Total Standardised Age Score (TSAS) is 200. AQE used a different range. Its highest SAS was about 130 with an average SAS of about 103. This means that a SEAG TSAS of 200 is “equivalent” to an AQE SAS of about 103. **Standardisation means that raw scores are adjusted**

# What to expect- Test days

- ▶ Tests are held in each of the participating grammar schools (and now Strangford College).
- ▶ When registering to do the test you select your preferred test centre on the application form.
- ▶ Important to register early to ensure a place at desired test centre.
- ▶ A familiarisation event will take place in most test centres nearer the time of the tests.
- ▶ Uniform must be worn on day of test.
- ▶ The test centre that you do the test in has no impact on where your child goes in first year.

# Example test day- in Regent House

- ▶ The majority of accommodation is in two halls, with pupils sitting with others from their primary schools if they apply early enough.
- ▶ Invigilators will be staff from grammar school- following common, agreed instructions (similar to GCSE and A level exams).
- ▶ Different test centres have different accommodation arrangements- some use classrooms instead of halls.

# Special Circumstances



- ▶ Relates to medical or other problems which may impact performance in the test.
- ▶ Extra time- need supporting evidence, make them aware on application- will possibly sit in separate room or given extra reading time.
- ▶ Special circumstances/arrangements are considered by the test centre school. Contact the test centre school for further information.

# What is expected from now until June for those preparing for SEAG Test?

- ▶ Extra Mathematics and Literacy homework at times - on top of normal homework.
- ▶ Corrections of tests discussed at home.
- ▶ Ensure all homework is completed to a high standard- ask your child to repeat if there are careless mistakes.
- ▶ Additional 2 hours of SEAG work during the school week (teacher covering those pupils not doing the test during this time).
- ▶ 1 test per week in school and one at home – this will increase in P7.



# What if my child isn't preparing for the test?

- ▶ They will continue with their normal Maths and Literacy classwork during the school day like the rest of the pupils.
- ▶ Complete standardised PTM and PTE tests as normal with rest of class.
- ▶ They will apply for post-primary schools at the same time as those pupils who do the test and will find out where they are going at the same time too.



# Summer Holidays!

We provide a summer pack of work (optional). It provides 6 weeks of work and revision at a subsidised cost of £30.

It is recommended that pupils:

- ▶ Complete two full tests per week (e.g. Mon. & Fri.)
- ▶ Complete revision papers and revision sheets (e.g. Tues., Wed. and Thurs.)
- ▶ Read every night!
